## 2019 – 2020 Full-Time Law Student Cost of Attendance

The College of Law provides an outline of costs that are reasonable for a student to attend Syracuse University College of Law and pursue the J.D. degree program. Figures 1 through 4 (below) represent the official cost of tuition and fees for a law student engaged in full-time study for the 2019-2020 academic year.

Figures within the budget categories 5 through 10 (below) may vary from student to student. These variations are acceptable as long as they do not exceed the maximum of \$74,000. For figures 5 through 10, please take into account all of your actual and expected expenses for one nine-month academic year of study, which extends from late August 2019 through May 2020.

Additional expenses must be approved by the College of Law Financial Aid Office with the proper documentation. Allowable types of budget adjustments may include the one-time cost of purchasing a computer or child care expenses, and the cost to purchase health insurance.\*

\*All full-time students are required to have Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant insurance coverage during the academic year. If you do not have sufficient coverage and need to purchase the university-sponsored insurance plan, the cost of the policy may be included in your cost of attendance upon request. A Health Insurance fee will be charged to all full-time students. This mandatory fee may be waived if a student has adequate private health insurance coverage. Expenses NOT allowed in the educational budget include costs of moving, payment of consumer debt (such as credit card payments), the purchase or upkeep of an automobile, costs associated with finding employment (interview expenses, clothing), and expenses incurred during periods of non-enrollment (i.e. summer).
