Estimated 2022-2023 Cost of Attendance for Full-time Residential Students

The College of Law provides an outline of estimated costs a student should anticipate while pursuing the J.D. degree program at Syracuse University College of Law. Figures 1 through 4 (below) represent the official cost of tuition and fees for a law student engaged in full-time study during the 2022-2023 academic year.

Figures within budget categories 5 through 10 typically vary from student to student; the estimates provided can be a helpful tool in guiding the development of a cost-of-living budget. For figures 5-10, please consider all of your actual and expected expenses for <u>one nine-month academic year of</u> <u>study</u> which extends from late August 2022 through May 2023. Total expenses should not exceed the maximum total allowance of \$82,030.

Expenses not allowed in the educational budget include the cost of moving, payment of consumer debt (such as credit card payments), the purchase or upkeep of an automobile, costs associated with finding employment (interview expenses, clothing), and expenses incurred during periods of nonenrollment (i.e. summer).

Full-time, residential students are required to have Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant insurance coverage during the academic year. A Health Insurance premium fee will be charged to all full-time students, but the fee may be waived if a student has adequate private health insurance coverage. Students who need to purchase the university-sponsored insurance plan may request to include the premium as part of their cost of attendance.
