



2023-2024 Cost of Attendance for Full-time Residential Students

The College of Law provides an outline of academic year costs a student should anticipate while pursuing the J.D. degree program as a full-time, residential student at Syracuse University College of Law. Figures 1 through 4 (below) represent the directly billed cost of tuition and fees for a law student engaged in full-time study during the 2023-2024 academic year.

Figures listed in categories 5 through 10 typically vary from student to student; the estimates are provided to guide the development of a cost-of-living budget. For figures 5-10, please consider all of your actual and expected expenses for the **nine-month academic year of study** which extends from late August 2023 through May 2024. Total expenses **should not exceed** the maximum total cost allowance.

Expenses not allowed in the educational budget include the cost of moving, security deposits, furnishings, payment of consumer debt (such as credit card payments), the purchase or upkeep of an automobile, costs associated with finding employment (interview expenses, clothing), and expenses incurred during periods of non-enrollment (i.e. summer).

Full-time, residential students are required to have Affordable Care Act (ACA) compliant insurance coverage during the academic year. The plan must provide comprehensive coverage for emergency and nonemergency services in the Syracuse area. A health insurance premium fee of \$2,474 will be charged to all full-time students, but the fee may be waived if a student has adequate private health insurance coverage. Students who need to purchase the university-sponsored insurance plan may request to include the premium as part of their cost of attendance.

The cost of the bar exam fee will be included in the cost of attendance for graduating students in their final year of the program.
