

New York Bar Admissions Checklist

□ Update Law School Records	 Make necessary <u>amendments</u> to law school application. Update law school records for new events. Ensure law school records and bar application match. Maintain detailed records of addresses and employment information.
☐ Take the MPRE	 Register during 2L year or as early in 3L year as possible. Administered three times per year in August, November, and March. Contact the Office of Academic and Bar Success for information about
	MPRE prep. ☐ Create an NCBE account and receive an NCBE number.
□ Create Accounts	☐ Create an NCBL account and receive a BOLE ID.
□ NYLC & NYLE	 Complete the New York Law Course (at least 30 days prior to NYLE). Register for the NYLE (30 days prior to exam). Pass the NYLE.
Register for Bar Prep Course	□ Kaplan Bar Review is free to all SUCOL students.□ Follow the email instructions from Kaplan to register.

New York Bar Admissions Checklist

Apply for the Exam	 Apply online between October 1 - 30 for the February exam and March 1 - 30 for the July exam. You must have both your NCBE ID number and your BOLE ID to apply. Make sure to register your laptop. If you skip this step, you will be required to handwrite your exam.
Pro Bono Requirement	□ Complete 50 hours of pro bono work□ Have pro bono supervisor complete affidavit of compliance.
Apply for Admission	 Application forms are uniform across appellate departments. In the Second, Third, and Fourth Departments, you can file application papers anytime after the bar exam. The First Department will only allow you to file after you have passed the exam. You must have the following to submit an application: application for admission questionnaire; good moral character affidavits; employment affidavits; pro bono affidavits, an original form certificate from the law school (submitted by you to the COL and then submitted by the COL to the appellate department.
