Note 15: The credits for this course count toward the satisfaction of ABA Standard 303(a)(3) which requires all College of Law students to satisfactorily complete one or more experiential course(s) totaling at least six credit hours. The credits for this course also count toward the satisfaction of the New York State Skills Competency Requirement for Admission to the Bar. To satisfy this requirement, students must successfully complete 15 credit hours of practice-based experiential coursework.

Note 16: This is a one semester externship. Students may register for 2-10 credits. Registration in one credit externship seminar is required.

Note 17: This course meets the Cultural Competency/DEI requirement.

Note 18: LLM elective. Meets with LAW 814 and LAW 815 for 3 credits for Fall semester and 3 credits for spring semester for a total of 6 credits. Will receive grade at the end of academic year.

Note 40: LCR I - Students must successfully complete LCR I before completing LCR II.

Note 41: LCR II - Students must successfully complete LCR II before enrolling in a Professional Writing Requirement course.

Note 42: LAW 798 - Travel to Switzerland over spring break 2024 to gain exposure to the foundational principles of international tax law. One weekend lectures (dates TBD, streamed online for non-SU students), plus travel to Europe for 9 days over spring break. Class size is limited to 20 students. Students who enroll in this course must participate in both the Syracuse and European portions of the program. Any LL.M. student, S.J.D. student, second-year or third-year J.D. residential law student, or J.D. interactive (Class of 2024-2026) student in good academic standing may enroll.

Note 45: LAW 799: Travel to Strasbourg, France, over Spring Break 2023 to gain exposure international and European Union human rights frameworks during visits to the European Court of Human Rights, the German Constitutional Court, and the European Council. One weekend lecture TBD, plus travel to Europe over spring break. Class size is limited to 14 students. Students who enroll in this course must participate in both the Syracuse and European portions of the program. Any LL.M. student, second-year J.D. law student, or third-year J.D. law in good academic standing may enroll. Any SU graduate student, subject to home academic department and College of Law approvals, may enroll. Enrollment subject to availability.

Note 48: LAW 994 dates and locations vary – Please check jdinteractive.syr.edu/for-admitted-students/residencies/ for more details – Course is offered in-person only and fulfills the JDi residency 5 or 6 requirement. Students must complete LAW 693 and LAW 793 before registering for this course.

Note 57: Due to course integration, enrollment in the Criminal Justice Reform Policy Lab is limited only to students also registered for Professor Gouldin's Criminal Justice Reform Seminar. Please contact Professor Gouldin for additional information.

Note 58: LAW 825 – this course replaced the old Law 814 sequence for those doing the Curricular Program. This course is the second part of a sequence (LAW 824 Advising the Startup I is the first part of the sequence). JD students enrolled in Law 824 in the Fall must take Law 825 to complete the sequence. JD students taking Law 825 without Law 824 can complete the sequence in the Fall. Non-JD students may take Law 825 without taking Law 824.

Note 60: LAW 800 in JD may only be taken in the last two semesters of coursework.

Note 61: Due to course integration, enrollment in this section of Trial Practice is limited only to students also registered for Professor Berger's section of Evidence (LAW 718 M001).

Note 62: Students may not register for both LAW 754 and LAW 893 M611: Pro Skills: Trial Practice with Professor Berger.

Note 63: Distressed Dealmaking will meet over four Fridays in Spring 2024 - January 26, March 8, March 29, and April 12. The course will meet from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm on those four Fridays. Students are required to attend all four class meetings.
